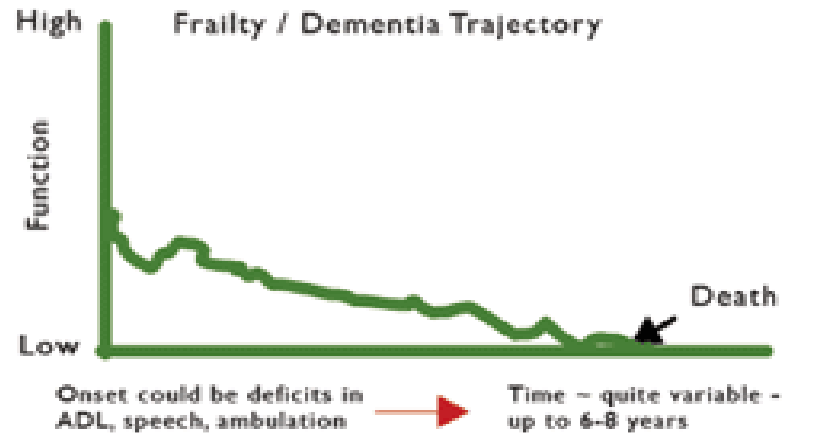
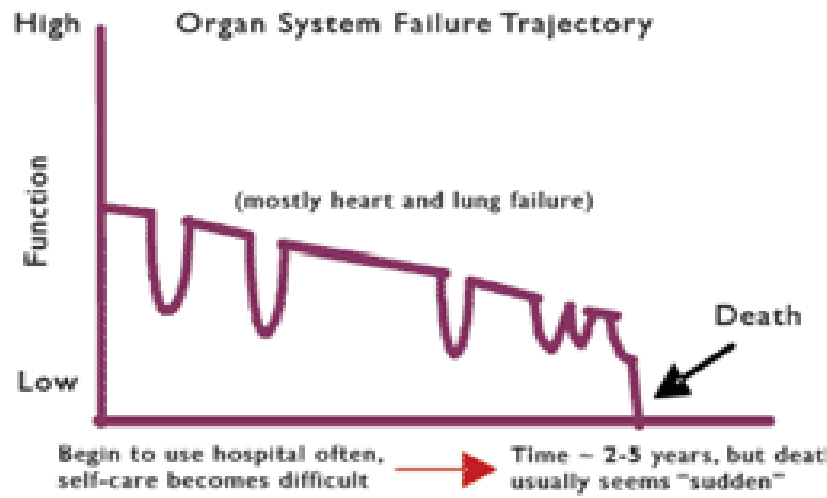
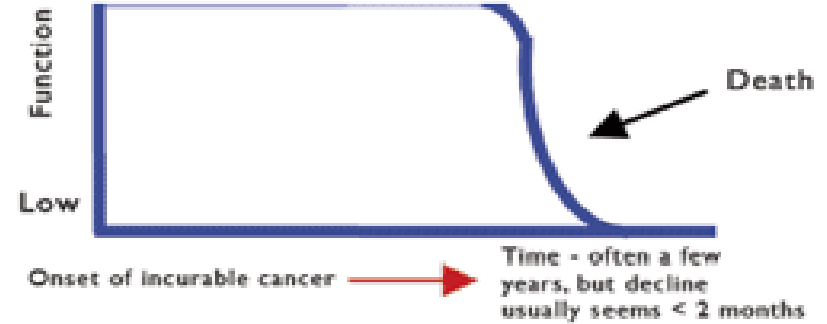
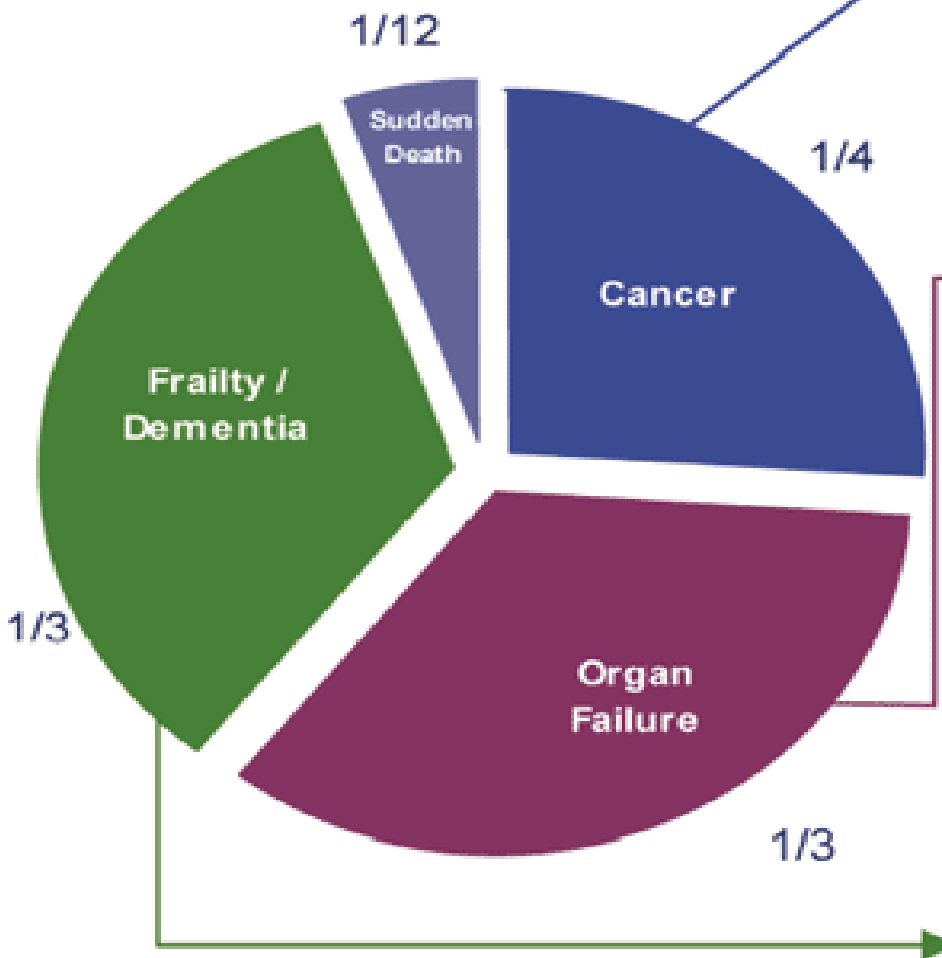




“palliatus” covered with a cloak



GPs' workload - Average 20 deaths/GP/yr (approximate proportions)



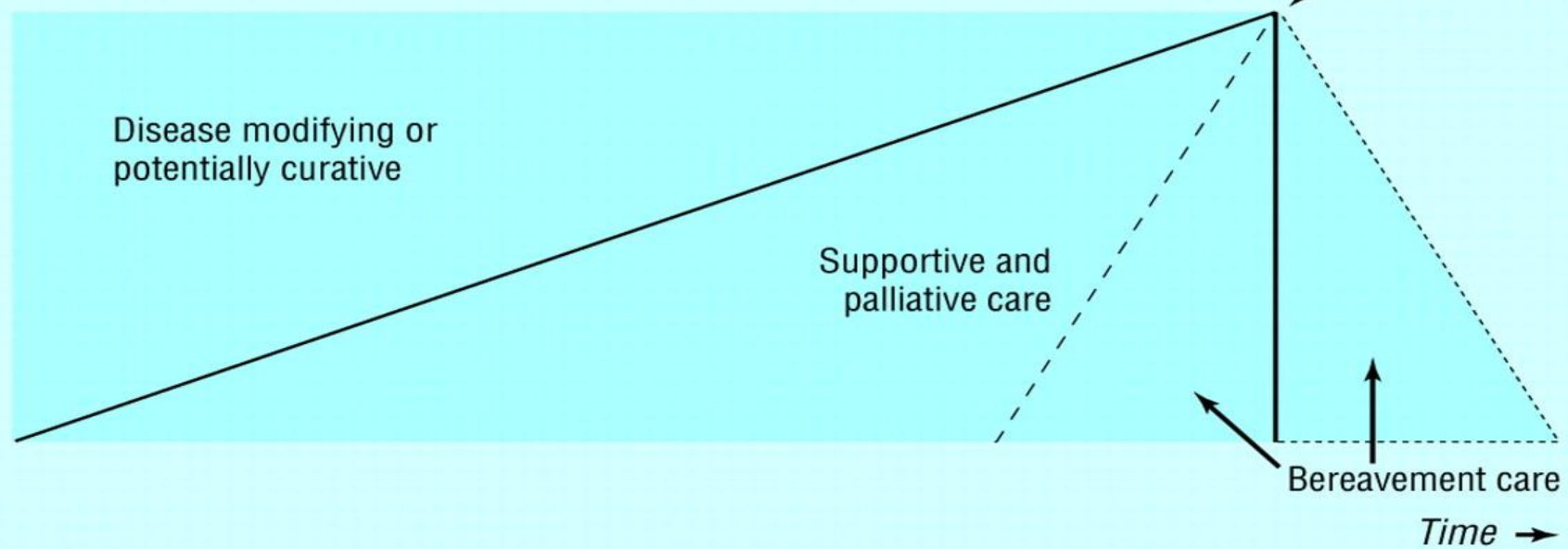
Old concept

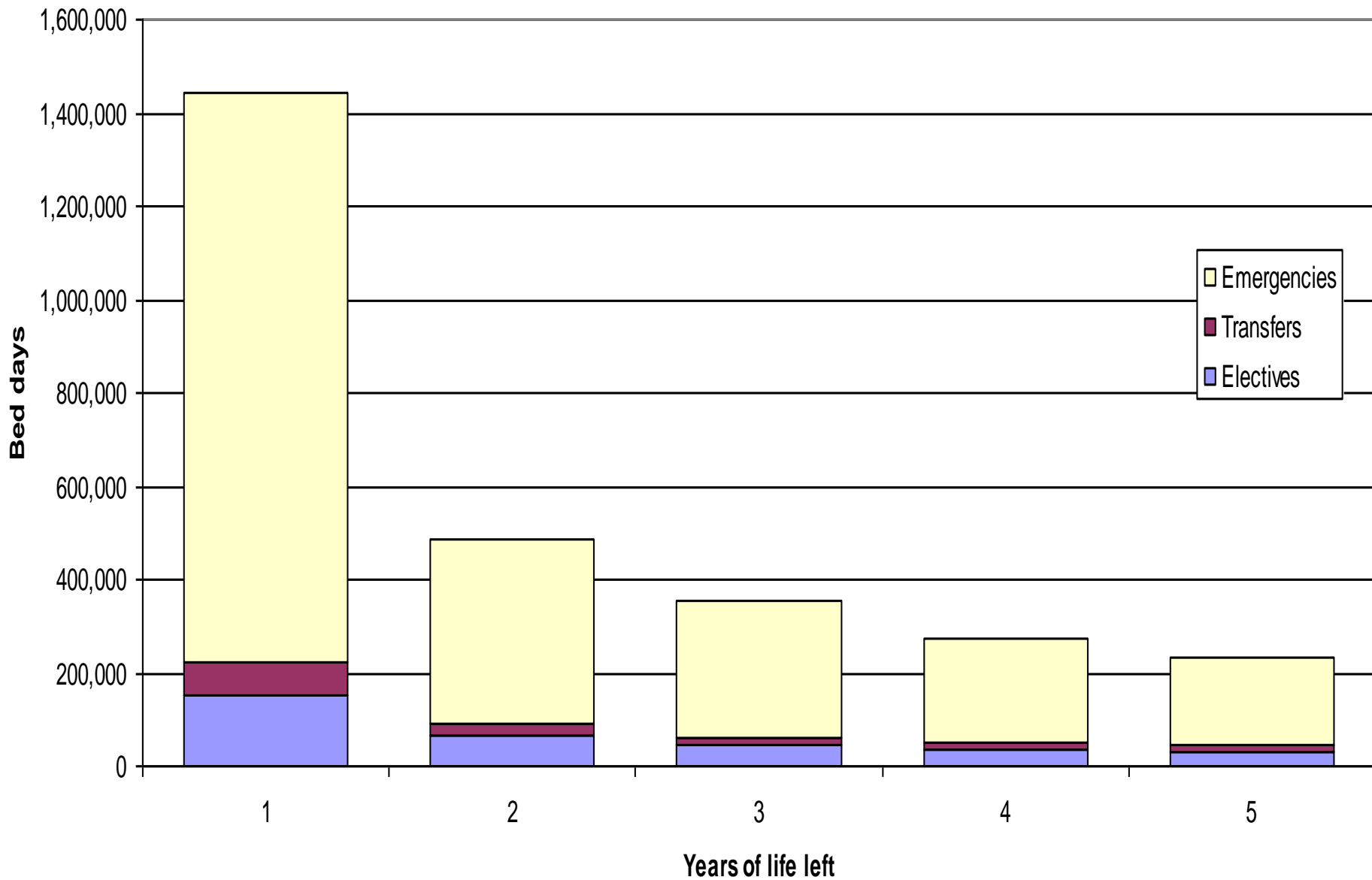

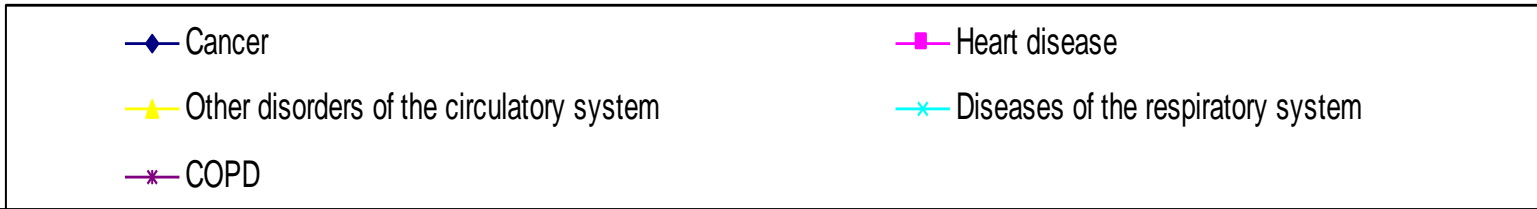
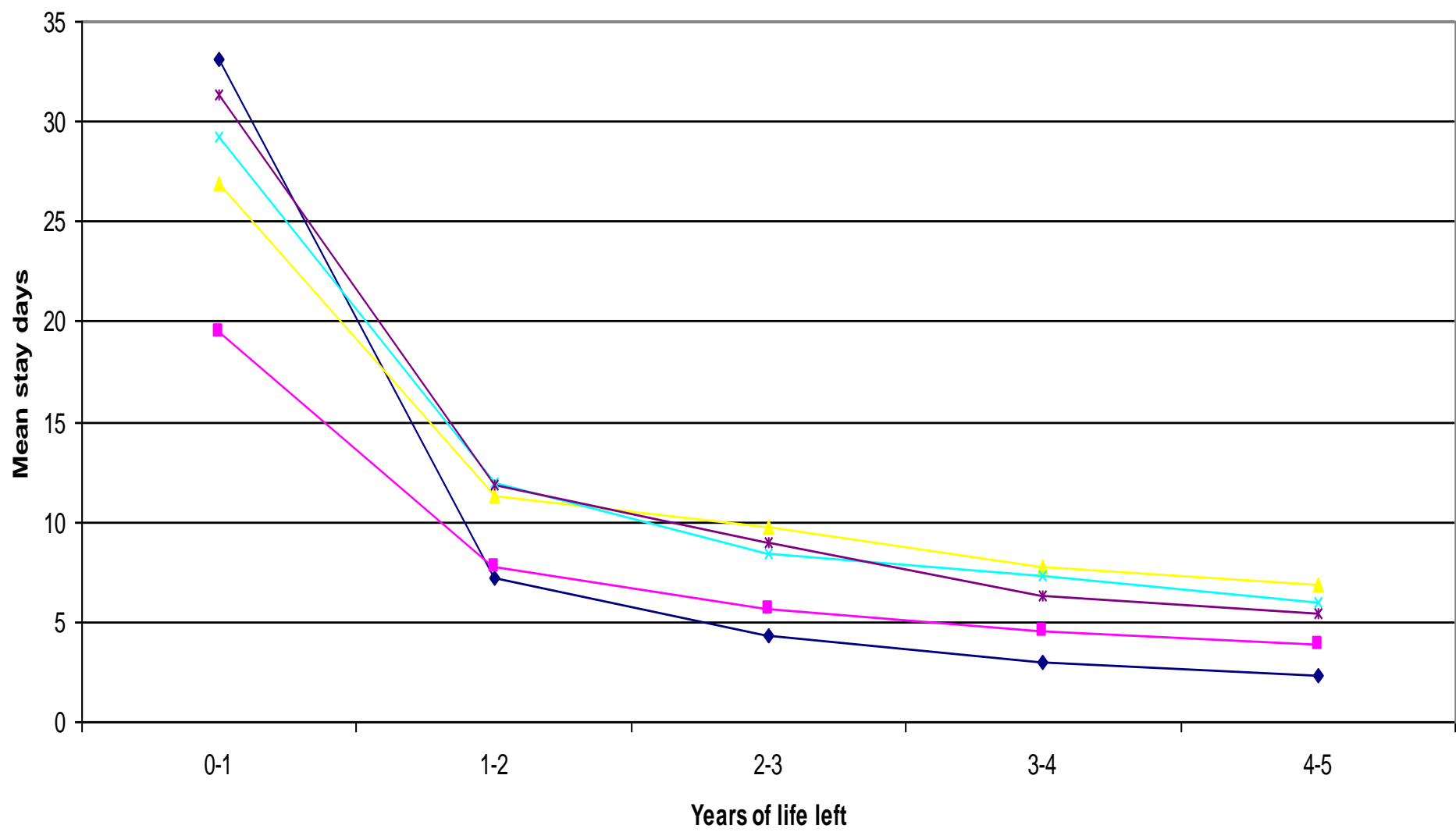
Where People Die 2006 data

Mean stay per year (denominator = number of deaths 2006)

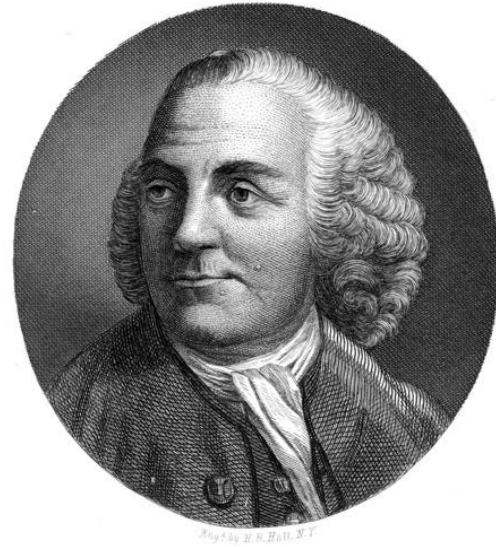
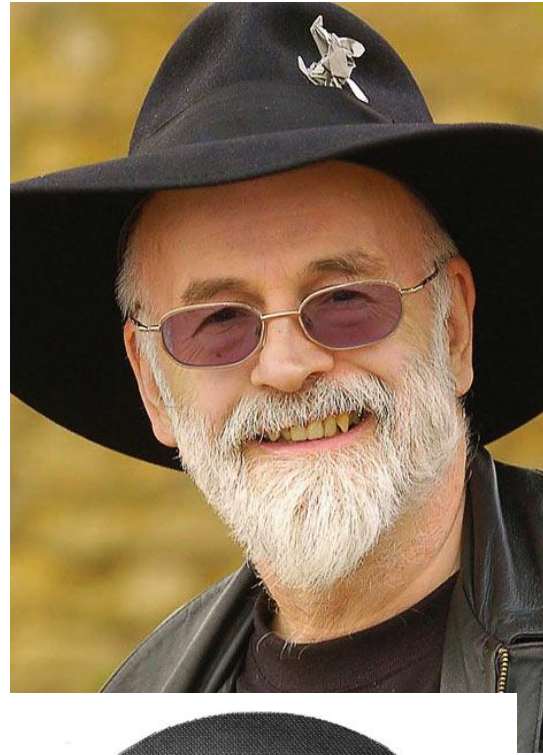
